### Self-study committee chairs are named

The leadership team for the upcoming institutional self-study is in place and members of the several principal committees are to be named soon.

Dr. Rickey L. Travis, associate professor of political science, will chair the Committee on Undergraduate Education Programs, and Dr. Robert L. Phillips Jr., professor of English, will be editor of the self-study report and chair of the Publications Committee. They join 12 other committee chairs announced earlier.

Also, Dr. Nancy Hargrove, Giles Distinguished Professor of English, has been named to fill a vacancy on the Self-Study Steering Committee, whose members also were announced earlier.

The Steering Committee and the principal committee chairs began work before the spring holiday to develop membership lists for each of the principal committees, said self-study Director Leslie Bauman. Those appointments will be made as soon as possible.

### Percussion concert rescheduled March 30

Originally scheduled for Feb. 16, a Mississippi State-sponsored concert of African music now will be performed March 30.

The university's Percussion Ensemble and Concert Choir will be joined by Jordan Benissan, a master musician from the West African nation of Togo, for a free 7:30 p.m. public program at the Bost Extension Center auditorium.

The February program was cancelled after a violent storm caused major damage and power outages throughout the area.

A part of the music education department's celebration of Black History Month, Benissan's visit is made possible through a grant from the Mississippi Arts Commission. The University Honors Program and Lois C. Kaufman Endowment for Music Education at MSU also are sponsors.

The percussion ensemble is directed by assistant professor Robert J. Damm and the concert choir is directed by associate professor Jeffrey L. Pappas.
